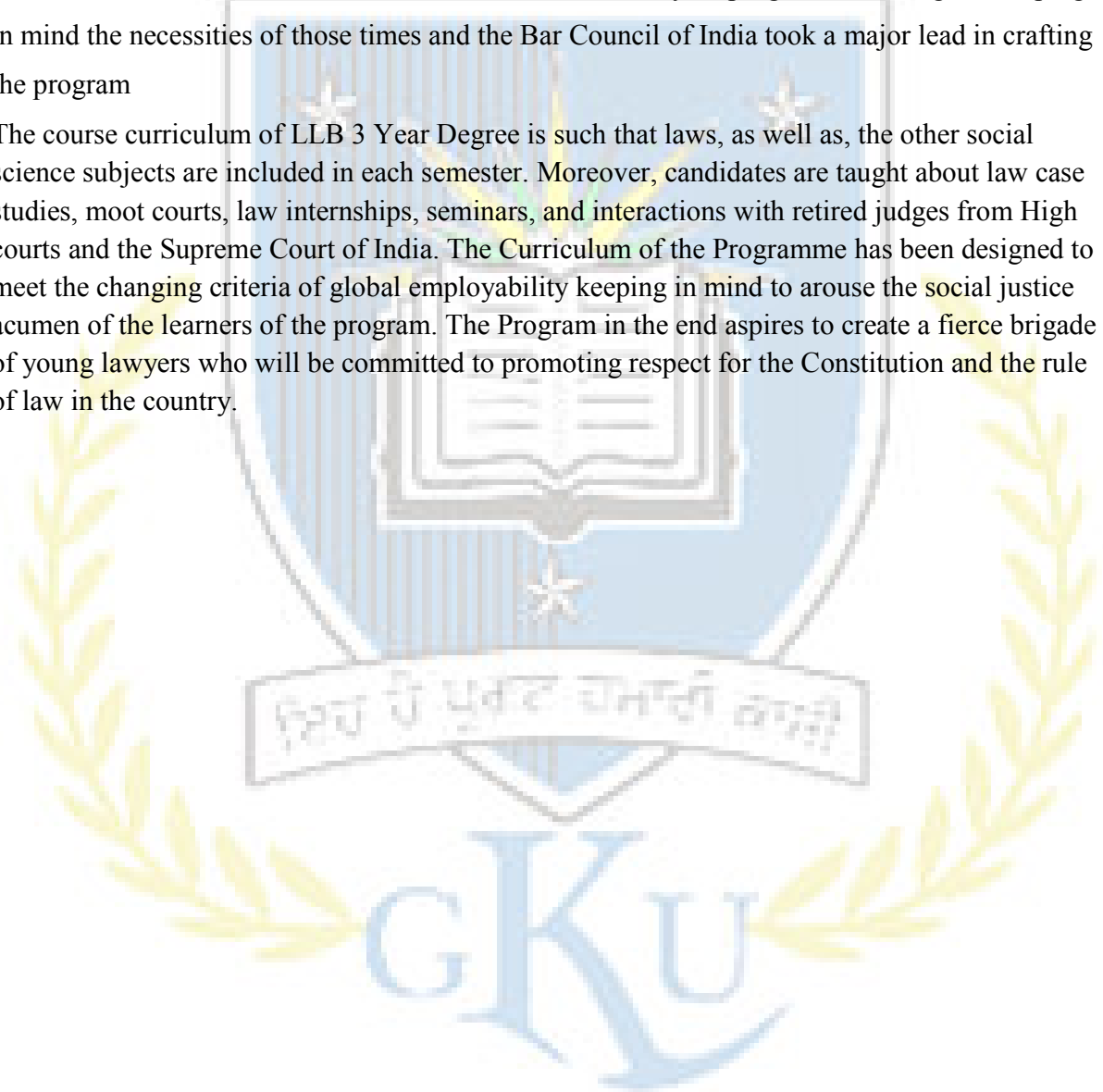


Annexure-1

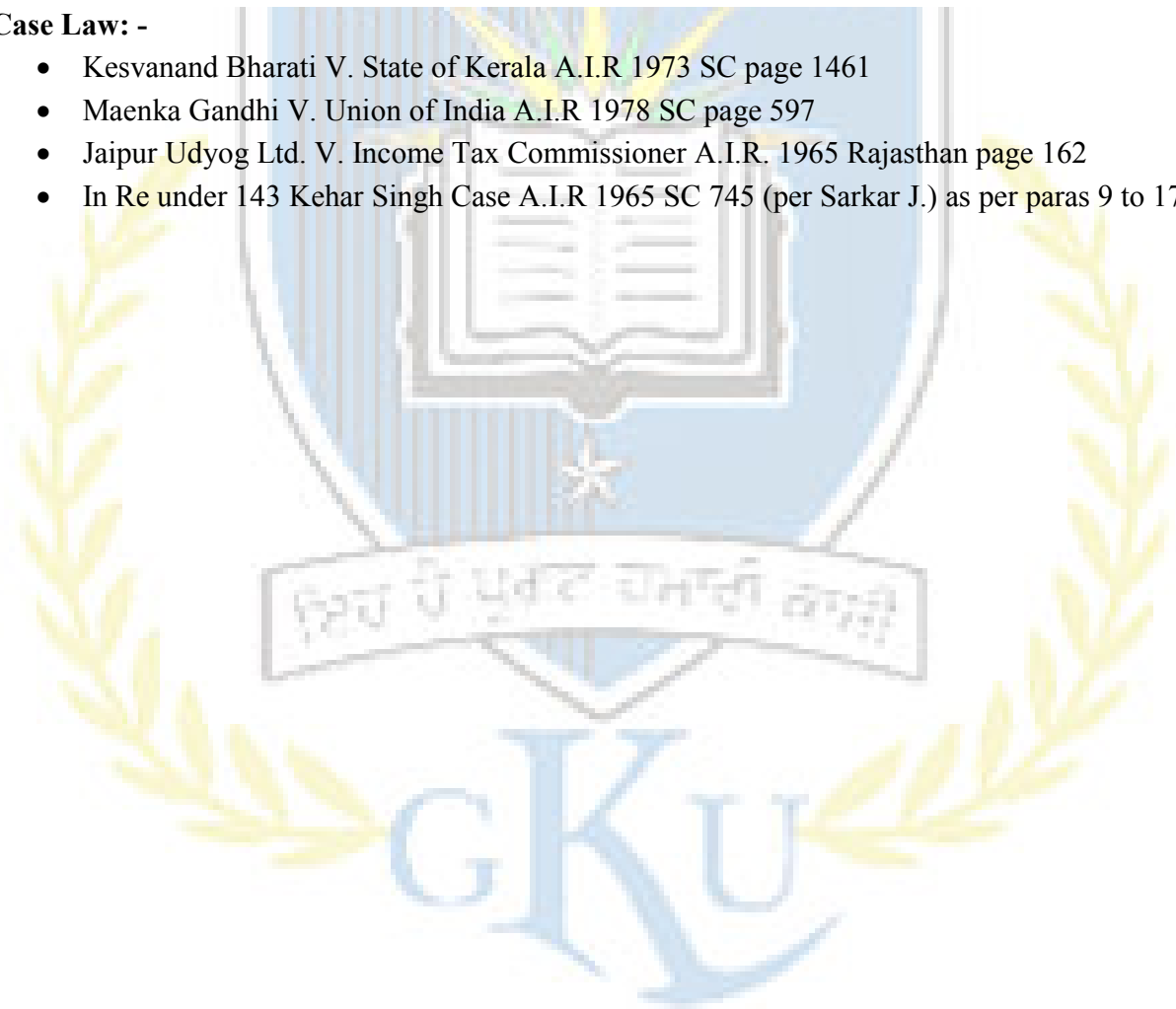

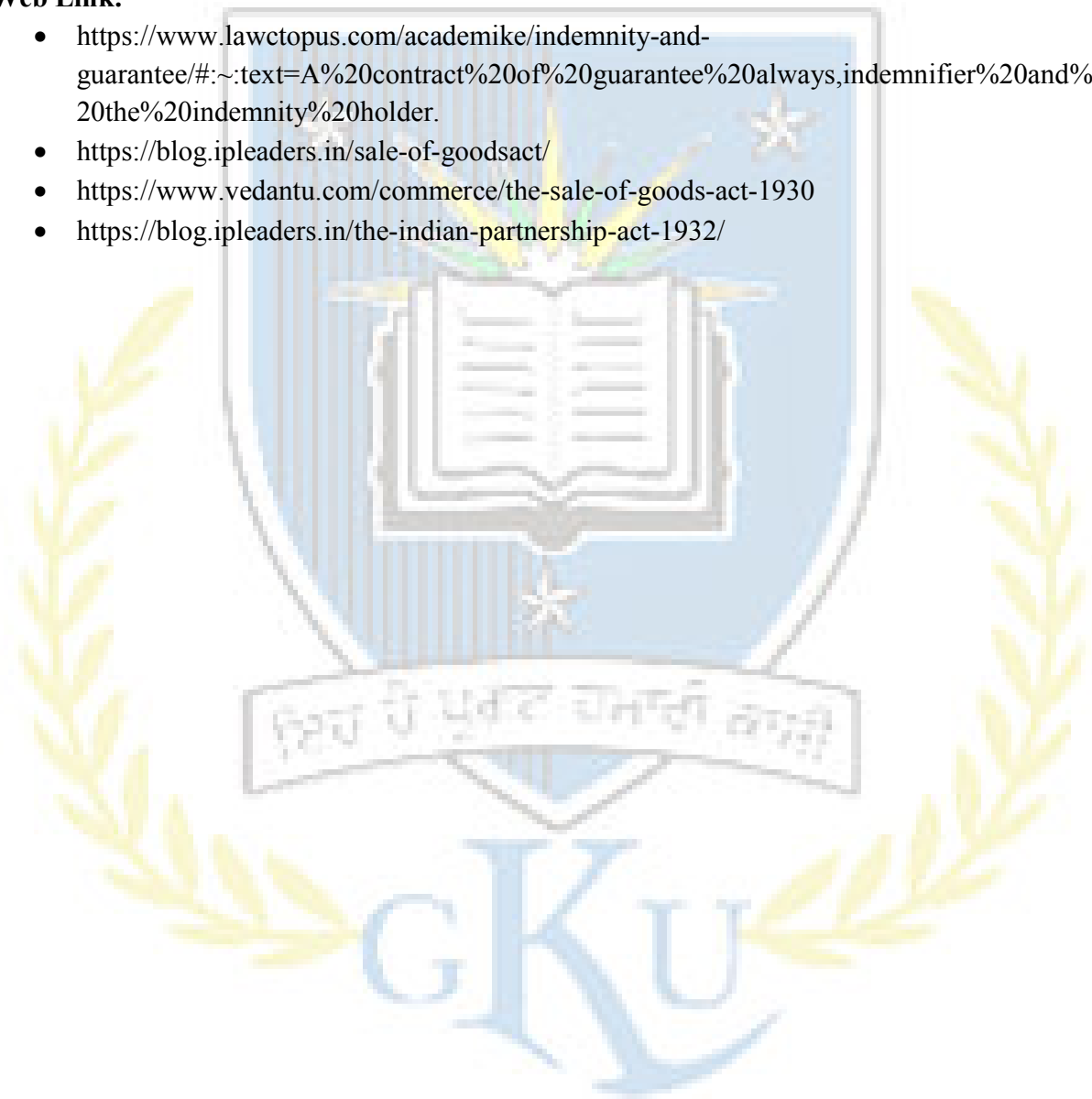

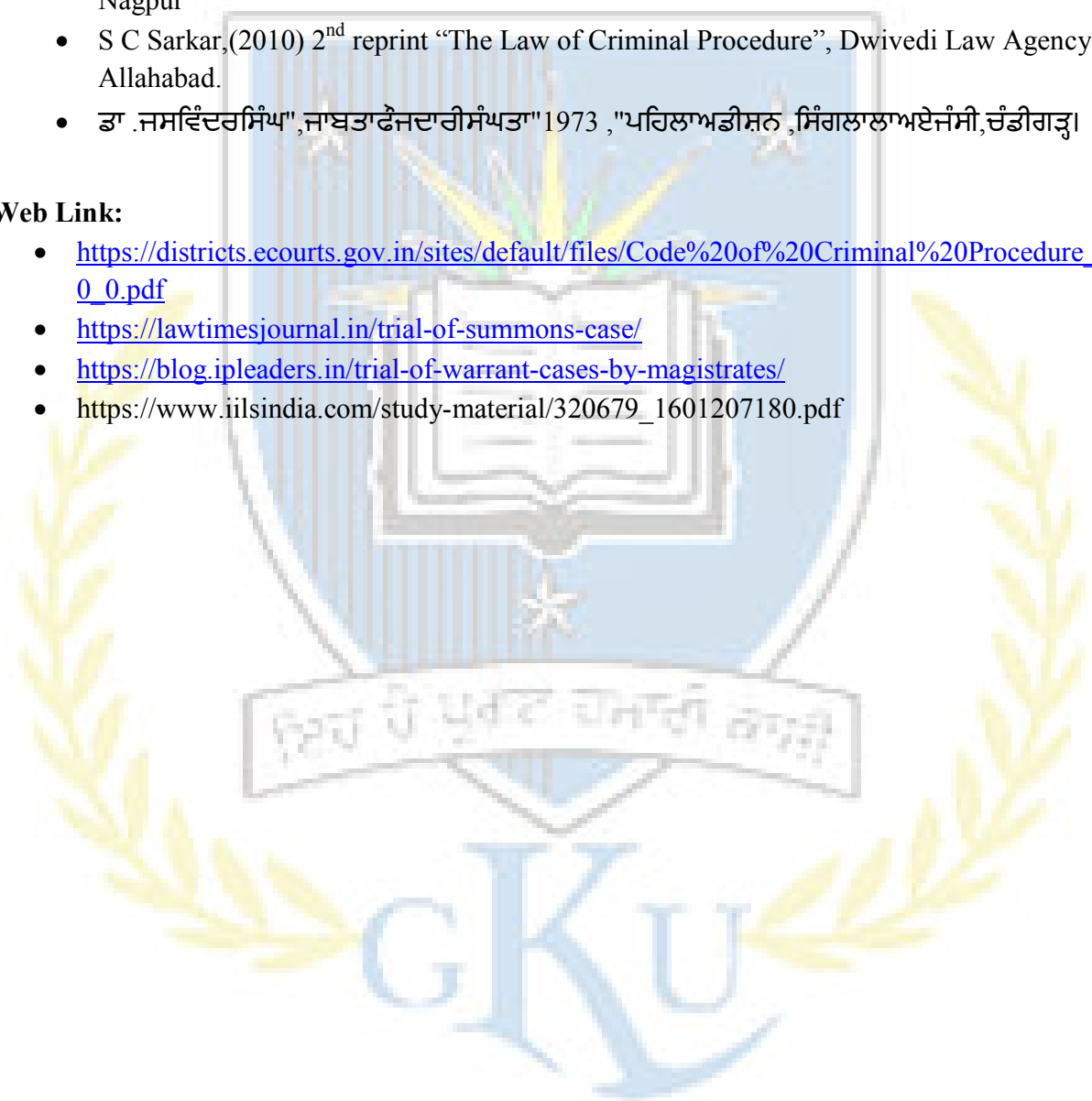
